REGISTRATION AND TECH INSPECTION

When you enter the facility please proceed to Gate three (3) and report to the registration office. Once your registration is confirmed and any required fees have been paid you will proceed up the hill entering the track at turn two of the oval, keep to your left and proceed around the oval in a clockwise rotation either your assigned pit area or directly to the tech garage on the floor of the facility at the far end of the oval near turns 3 and 4. Inspections for all vehicles, street driven or race will occur at the tech garage as per inspection requirements. Vehicles will enter from the spectator side (grandstands) or dragstrip side, through the tech garage and continue in a clockwise rotation when exiting. Tech inspection will be available at the tech garage on the day of the event from the time pit gate opens and continue throughout the test and tune session. Vehicles arriving after test and tune has ended will be advised at the entrance gate of tech location and availability. Please note: Vehicles that have not been approved by a track official or have not meet safety regulations are not permitted to enter the staging lanes or proceed down the dragstrip unless directed by a track official.

ALL VEHICLES ARE REQUIRED TO MEET THE SAFETY REGULATIONS AS OUTLINED IN THE 2021 IHRA MOTORSPORTS OFFICIAL RULEBOOK UNDER THE HEADINGS "GENERAL REGULATIONS-ALL CLASSES" AND "SUMMIT SPORTSMAN SAFETY AND GENERAL RULES" APPLICABLE TO THE ELAPSED TIME (ET) OF YOUR VEHICLE IN THE 1/8 MILE.

ALL STREET DRIVEN AND ALTERNATE USE VEHICLES (INCLUDES BIKES/SLEDS/ATV/UTV)

For street driven vehicles and alternate use vehicles a tech inspection must be completed at each

<u>event</u>. One complete inspection is mandatory at the first attended event for the season and a more general inspection at each subsequent event. All drivers **must** have their inspection sheet completed and signed by the track official before entering the staging lanes. Inspection sheets will be available at the tech garage. Vehicles attending concurrent events (Sat/Sun) will not be subject to inspection the second day. Drivers however must still report to the tech garage on each individual day to present or sign their verification sheet. **Please do not park in or enter any staging lane before paying your entry fees or having your tech inspection completed or we will ask you to move your vehicle to the gravel area on the right side of the lanes. No vehicles will be permitted to go down the track prior to the tech inspection or until all applicable fees for the current events are up to date**

RACE ONLY VEHICLES (INCLUDES JR. DRAGSTERS)

<u>One complete inspection is mandatory at the first attended event for the season only.</u> Verification of entry for each event for race only vehicles is confirmed also at the Tech Garage. Although all fees have been paid at the gate it is mandatory all drivers report to the Tech Garage and sign a verification sheet. This confirms for the tower your entry to the event. It is the responsibility of the driver to ensure all fees for the current event have been paid and failure to complete

payment of fees at the gate or reporting to the tech garage before entering the staging lanes results in significant delays in the tower as our records will not have that car recorded in the field for that event. Drivers must use staging lanes 1 thru 4 only and are not permitted to use the emergency lane on the far right. Jr. Dragsters **only** may use the far right unnumbered lane but a stop line will be identified to permit access for emergency vehicles. **Please do not park in or enter any staging lane before paying your entry fees as we will ask you to move your vehicle to the gravel area on the right side of the lanes. No vehicles will be permitted to go down the track prior to the tech inspection or until all applicable fees for the current events are up to date.**

INFORMATION SHEET

During your first visit to the track for a new season there is a one time mandatory requirement to complete an information sheet. This sheet provides the necessary information for the tower to correctly identify the driver and the vehicle particulars during the event. There is a provision on the sheet as well to provide details on your sponsors/supporters which the announcer will make every effort to promote when your car is in competition. This sheet will be available for submission at www.eastboundpark.com so it can be completed before you arrive at the track or one will be made available to you upon entry at the gate. An update to your information sheet for car or sponsorship changes can be submitted online at any time.

BURNOUTS

Due to the increased use of street tires and **drag radials** we are experiencing difficulty in maintaining the condition of our starting line. We have determined extra preparation will be required to ensure optimal conditions and we will be implementing procedures to achieve that goal. Even when we prep the track properly, it requires the cooperation of all drivers for good track conditions to last throughout the event.

In an effort to provide a safe and effective starting line for 2021 we will be requesting all drivers with **street tires** and **drag radials** to limit their burnouts to the water box area and just beyond. **We specifically request that you do not burnout through the starting line area**. We are asking for your cooperation at this time but if it is felt that this request is not being observed by any driver, track officials will address the concern individually with that driver. If track officials observe the request is not being adhered to by multiple drivers additional restrictions may be implemented.

GAMBLERS SERIES

Note - Delay boxes are not permitted to be used during any Gambler events

The additional entry fee for Gamblers is \$20.00. There will be **no buy backs** permitted but we will be offering an option to purchase a mulligan at the time of entry for an additional \$20.00 which can be used in any round, with the exception of the semi-final or final round. The mulligan **MUST** be purchased at the time of entry and all monies collected being awarded to the winning drivers.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: All gamblers and/or mulligan fees **MUST** be paid at the point of entry on Saturday morning. There will be no prepay option for this fee and no other purchase option will be available at this time. Money must be the exact amount as no change will be available. Please place your gamblers fee (\$20) and **optional** mulligan fee (\$20) in an

envelope and clearly print your name, car # and the amount enclosed on the outside of the envelope, **DO NOT seal** the envelope at this time. The unsealed envelope MUST be passed to the attendant at the registration gate who will confirm the amount inside is correct with you and once verified, seal the envelope in your presence.

GAMBLER COMPETITION

- 1. Two ladders will be created within one gamblers event and we will split the field equally based on car count to be known as Group A and Group B.
- 2. All quicker ET's go on one side of the ladder, with the slower ET's on the other.
- 3. If there are an uneven number of cars, the odd car will be placed in the most applicable field by race officials.
- 4. If the fields have been set, late entries will be placed in the field based on verifiable data. If we have no data available on a car for class identification it will be placed in the applicable ET field as determined by track officials. Please note if you have made a qualifying run on the event day, the ET recorded will be entered as your position in the field.
- 5. All vehicles will compete within their own group until a winner id declared at which time the winner of group A will compete against the winner of group B for the overall winner of the event.
- 6. The Gamblers series will use card draw in the staging lanes for competition parings, including bye runs and competition will be a sportsman tree.

Answer the call for first round, stage under your own power - 20 points

Round win - 10 points

Final round appearance while staging under your own power - 1 point

Event winner final round win - 10 points + 3 bonus points

.500 reaction time during competition - 1 point (multiples count) **GAMBLERS EVENTS ONLY**

GAMBLERS PAYOUT

Group A final round runner-up: \$30.00 payout

Group B final round runner-up: \$30.00 payout

Group A final round winner: 25% of remaining pot after runner-up payouts

Group B final round winner: 25% of remaining pot after runner-up payouts

Group A & B final round winner: 50% of remaining pot after runner-up payouts

THUNDER SERIES

IHRA membership is **NOT REQUIRED** to compete in the Thunder Series and you may accumulate points for year end awards. You must however have a current IHRA membership to be eligible for the Summit Super Series.

Pairings - Random Pairings by card draw, including any bye run.

- 1. Super Pro Et 7.00 and quicker Delay boxes permitted ***
- 2. Pro/Street/Bike/Sled Et 6.80 and slower No delay box permitted * ** ***
- 3. Vehicles with an ET between 6.80 and 7.00 may enter their class of choice, superpro or pro, but must meet the safety requirements of that class and abide by current rules for the class chosen
- 4. Points are awarded for the class you choose to compete in and no transfer of points is permitted from one class to another
- 5. ATV/UTV Any Et No delay box permitted
- 6. Jr. Dragster Any ET No delay box permitted * **
- *Cars in pro, street, bike, sled and Jr. Dragster with delay boxes must have the delay box zeroed.
- **If car numbers are not sufficient for a separate class in pro, street, bike or sled those classes may be combined into one field for eliminations.

***No driver may change vehicles once eliminations have begun. However, a driver may enter a substitute vehicle before eliminations provided the substitute vehicle is capable of the original vehicles ET bracket. If the substitute vehicle is outside the original vehicles ET bracket A ONE weekend grace period is permitted for the total race season and points may be awarded for the current class. If a driver wishes to continue with the substitute vehicle beyond the one time exception he/she must change to the substitute vehicles ET bracket with no transfer of points from the original class.

CONSOLATION ROUND

- 1. Consolation round is open to any participant who was unsuccessful in securing the win in round one of either the super-pro or pro/street/bike/sled competition
- 2. There no points awarded in the Consolation rounds

POINTS-THUNDER SERIES

Answer the call for first round, stage under your own power - 20 points Round win - 10 points

Final round appearance while staging under your own power - 1 point

Event winner final round win - 10 points + 3 bonus points

THUNDER PAYOUTS

SUPERPRO AND PRO/STREET/BIKE/SLED

- A. PAYOUT TOTAL IS \$25.00 PER ENTRY
- B. \$300.00 MINIMUM PAYOUT
- C. PAYOUT FOR 1ST (60%) AND 2ND (30%)
- D. CONSOLATION ROUND (WINNER ONLY 10%)
- E. MINIMUM OF EIGHT (8) ENTRIES REQUIRED TO RUN EACH CLASS
 - If less then 8 vehicles in any of the above classes we may combine the classes for competition where track rules and safety regulations permit.
 - Note: All payouts rounded

C. TO QUALIFY FOR KING OF THE HILL A DRIVER MUST BE IN ATTENDANCE FOR 75% OF THE OFFICIALLY SCORED RUNS IN THE THUNDER SERIES (the 75% attendance applies to king of the hill only) D. NO EXCLUSIVE IHRA SUMMIT SUPER SERIES FOR 2021. INCORPORATED INTO THE THUNDER SERIES EVENT. POINTS WILL BE PULLED FROM THE THUNDER CLASSES, TRACKED THROUGHOUT THE SEASON (until August 2021) AND LEADERS IN THE FOUR IHRA SSS DIVISIONS WILL BE THE IHRA SSS TRACK CHAMPIONS.

E. BIKES AND SLEDS ARE ELIGIBLE GAMBLERS, THUNDER AND KING OF THE HILL AWARDS. ANY OTHER OFF ROAD VEHICLES ARE NOT CURRENTLY ELIGIBLE FOR THE ABOVE CLASSES AS NUMBERS DO NOT WARRANT, AN ADDITIONAL CLASS WILL BE ADDED IF NUMBERS WARRANT AT FUTURE EVENTS (8 OR MORE)

TIE BREAKERS

- (1) Driver with most officially scored races attended (Show Points during the current season)
- (2) Driver with the MOST FINAL ROUND WINS in points races during the current season
- (3) Driver with the MOST RACE RUNNER-UPS in points races during the current season
- (4) Driver with the MOST SEMI-FINAL ROUND APPEARANCES in points races during the current season

NOTE: To earn points for any run you must stage under power including any bye run. Bye runs can be a test & tune pass or drive through after staging. <u>For safety reasons reversing of any type vehicle out of the staging area and driving in the reverse direction through the staging lanes is not permitted</u>. Please respect this policy.

Summit SuperSeries Step #1

Be a Summit SuperSeries member of the IHRA, including membership benefits, a license and a Summit SuperSeries number (X-Number). The second digit of the number will be the letter "X" or the last digit on Junior Dragsters. Competitors with permanent numbers already on their vehicle and are joining the Summit SuperSeries for the first time may request to have the X as the last digit of their car number regardless of class. If a racer runs multiple classes, they must have a different X-Number registration for each class. A competitor may only compete with one X-Number per class at any given facility. IHRA membership, license & number application is available at www.eastboundpark.com or by contacting Bob Smith at bob@eastboundpark.com

Summit SuperSeries Step #2

Sign up for points at a participating IHRA Summit SuperSeries Track. Points will be accumulated from the Thunder Series at Eastbound Dragway.

Summit SuperSeries Step #3

Race at an IHRA track while running Summit SuperSeries X-Number. Summit SuperSeries eligibility does not begin until a valid X-Number with the IHRA is obtained, used as the car number and on the track's points list.

Failure to Run the X-Number or failure of that number to appear on the track's points list may make a racer ineligible for the Summit SuperSeries even if a registered X-Number is on file with IHRA. Failure to maintain a current membership will result in a deduction in points for the events the membership was expired. "Gifted Rounds" are not permitted. Racers receiving "dives" as determined solely by IHRA may be disqualified.

Summit SuperSeries Step #4

• Become the Summit SuperSeries Champion

QUICK 8 AND QUICK 16

PLEASE NOTE: YOU MUST QUALIFY DURING THE SPECIFIED TIME FOR YOUR CLASS TO BE ENTERED INTO EITHER QUICK HEADS-UP COMPETITION. If you do not attend qualifying or do not make the field you are still welcome to make fill-in runs for the remainder of the event.

QUICK 8 RACE HEADS-UP (any vehicle not eligible for street use or currently not licenced or insured, excludes juniors)

This series will be a quick 8 only and is for any type of vehicle either not eligible for street use (ex. Dragster, Race only modified). Also any vehicle not deemed acceptable by race officials or any potential street vehicle that is NOT currently road LEGAL. A vehicle that is not currently licenced or insured is not road legal falls in this category.

QUICK 8 or 16 **STREET** HEADS-UP (Street use only!!!!) *Any dot approved tire*, any engine, any power adder but if your vehicle does not meet the criteria outlined below please compete in the Quick 8 RACE above.

This series is for any vehicle considered street worthy and currently street legal with a **current/valid registration/licence and insurance**. Street worthy means a vehicle able to pass an NL inspection and raced in street trim with working lights, complete interior, approved glass, exhaust etc. Exhaust must be acceptable for street use with regard to sound and permanent fitment, <u>NO temporary hang-on</u>. **All tires MUST be DOT approved and the stamp must be visible**. Track officials retain the right to disqualify any vehicle not meeting the requirements and may also request immediate proof of valid registration and insurance. (carry it in your vehicle or on your person, a sticker on the plate is not acceptable, documentation **MUST** be provided if requested)

The quick series events will use either a sportsman ladder or a draw from the hat for competition pairings but a **PRO TREE**

GENERAL COMPETITION INFORMATION

Please do not use the staging lanes for general parking and do not proceed to the staging lanes unless your class or fill-in runs have been called. Doing so results in unnecessary congestion, race delays, and often difficulty for track officials to organize car fields. Also the unnumbered far right staging lane is a mandatory emergency lane, parking in that lane beyond the stop line at any time is not acceptable, but during competition it is strictly prohibited.

- 1. All vehicles will be inspected in accordance with Eastbound International Dragway rules and 2021 Summit IHRA Motorsports Official Rulebook
- 2. Driver must wear full length pants, shirt, and closed shoes (t-shirt permitted)
- 3. All drivers must utilize a helmet and protective clothing requirements as per the minimum specifications outlined in the 2021 Summit IHRA Motorsports Official Rulebook under the ET bracket they are competing in
- 4. Dial-ins and car number must be on driver's side quarter glass and rear windows (recommend dragsters use display panel). A track official will provide a car number but it is solely the driver's responsibility to place the number and dial-in on the car in an area clearly visible to the tower.
- 5. While it is <u>recommended</u> delay boxes are removed or disconnected for specific competitions, it is solely the driver's responsibility to ensure the delay box, if on-board, is not operational for any starting line advantage. If a delay box is observed being used for any starting line advantage in any NO-BOX event or class the driver is immediately disqualified from the event and all points/earnings for that event are forfeited
- 6. We request all street cars with air conditioning to please turn it off, completely off. The water from the unit drops to the track causing an unsafe condition, not only for you if water drips under your tires, but for the driver in that lane behind you.
- 7. All hubcaps and beauty rings must be removed from wheels
- 8. Any equipment remaining in the vehicle must be securely mounted (ex. stereo equipment, speakers, controllers, etc. Officials have the right to deny any vehicle deemed not safe or stop any vehicle deemed unsafe at any time during the competition.
- 9. All cars are requested to proceed around the infield area in a clockwise rotation for warm-up and returning to the pit area. It is important to note there are certain areas where two way traffic flows. Please observe our 5 mph (8km) speed limit in all areas. Driving without respect for other drivers, spectators or track officials will not be tolerated.
- 10. The track surface is prepared for maximum traction and safety for our drivers and track staff. In an effort to ensure that safety is maintained we will not permit soft compound tires (ex, ice radials, and snow rated tires) or any off road design tires to enter the starting line area.
- 11. Pairings, bye runs and lane choice by card draw or chip from the hat.

- 12. Once paired in the staging lanes the race is official, unnecessary delays, refusal to compete or breakage not allowing you to complete the race results in disqualification. In the event of a no start or minor breakage during **normal competition** a maximum of two additional minutes as determined by track officials will be allowed to make the call. The driver will be advised of the two minute warning. If time permits or a special event is occurring, exceptions may apply.
- 13. For safety reasons reversing of any type vehicle out of the staging area and driving in the reverse direction through the staging lanes is not permitted
- 14. Dial-in boards must be reviewed by the driver on each run, competition or other and accepted. If a driver enters the pre-stage, it is understood that he/she has accepted the dial-in entered by the tower to be correct and accepts the race. If not considered correct the driver must inform the starter before pre-staging of the error and the starter will notify the tower of the requested correction. If the race is accepted there is no option for dispute based on the dial-in.
- 15. Red-lights count and result in elimination. In the event of a double red-light the driver who red-lights first is eliminated
- 16. Any vehicle crossing the center line, coming in contact with any safety retainer is immediately disqualified no matter—what the outcome at the end of the track. This infraction would supersede a red light in the opposite lane.
- 17. If you receive a bye run in competition you must stage the car under its own power and at a minimum take the tree (stage) to be granted a win. Red lights or boundary infractions are not grounds for disqualification on bye runs. For safety reasons you are not permitted to stage your car for a bye run and then back out of the lights, last motion must be forward. Reversing of a car in the staging area is not permitted
- 18. If dual infractions occur in a competition run the car making the worst infraction will be disqualified, if the infractions are considered equal the first offender will be disqualified
- 19. Right lane always has the right-of-away for entering the return road, no matter what the ET of the racing vehicles in either lane is. It is mandatory that the right lane be given priority; left lane must always yield until right lane car has entered the return road.
- 20. We make every effort to ensure announcements and calls to staging lanes are timely and clear. We will make every effort to ensure drivers are advised their class is current being called or running. It is important to note though that it is the driver's responsibility to be ready and be attentive to when his or her class is called. If a driver does not make the call for their class their opponent will be granted a bye run and they will be eliminated from competition (min two calls).
- 21. If you have a concern please ensure you bring it to out attention at the tower. We do request though that only the driver(s) enter the tower with the information they wish to present.
- 22. These rules can be amended at any time by the Race Director and all decisions of the Race Director are final
